“Care-Free Cremation™” Process

This process ensures our families a high degree of confidence in our cremation process, and allows them to take an active part. Please note that the State of Michigan does not allow a funeral home to own or operate a cemetery or crematory, nor can any cemetery or crematory operate a funeral home. This “anti-combo” law provides a wonderful check and balance for both the crematory and funeral home providing services. The crematory we use is open to all of our families for inspection, if you wish to fully participate in the process please call for an appointment or notify us at the time of death.

Steps of the “Care-Free Cremation™”

1. At the time of death a loved ones identity is confirmed before being labeled with an identification band at the funeral home.
2. The cremation container is fully labeled and placed into our secure holding area or refrigeration.
3. Your loved one is then logged into the system as a licensed funeral director reviews all paperwork and permits. This ensures that proper authorization from the medical examiner has been received.
4. Upon arrival to the crematory, cemetery administration reviews all authorizations and permits. The deceased is then logged into their system for processing.
5. A non-combustible ID tag is placed with your loved one and noted throughout the entire process until it is completed.
6. If desired, up to (5) family members are welcome to meet our staff at the crematory for a pre-cremation inspection.
7. You will then have the opportunity to see that the cremation chamber is clean and empty and to witness the cremation container entering the cremation chamber.
8. You may then wait in the family area until the cremation process is complete and receive your loved one’s cremains the same day. A crematory operator will be available to answer any questions.
